

Fabric choices: Any Quilting Cottons

Fabric colors: Dark (D1 - D6) = Browns and Blacks, Solids or Prints Light (L1 - L6)=Beige, Tans, & Grays Solids or Prints Red=True Red. Solid Only

Cutting:

Darks = $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 18" strips Lights = $1.1/2 \times 18$ " strips

Step 1: Use the pattern above as the foundation for paper piecing. Make as many copies as needed. Cut out the pattern leaving a little extra material on all sides. Make sure the marked lines are visible from the back side.

Step 2: Choose your fabric and cut strips. Cut pieces from the strips.


Step 3: Sew pieces in order (1 then 2 then 3, etc.).

Step 4: Make 4 individual blocks, making sure to leave the 1/4' seam allowances.

Step 5: Assemble the 4 blocks, first like Diagram A and next like Diagram B below.

Step 6: Write your name and the name of the guild on back of the completed block.

Step 7: Mail completed block, in sturdy packaging, to the address above by April 8, 2019. See submission form on other side or website. Send email to quiltproject@sdusmp.org.



Note: If you would like to commemorate an enslaved person or freed person, use a pigma fine point pen and write the name on a light (LT) log.
